He's Building Mission

'As each part does its own special work.' There's a call upon your life. You're called to a special work and you're anointed.

We just need to be in the right place in our hearts to walk in that calling.

In Acts 10 God has to change Peter's heart because you can't receive new miracles with old mindsets. His mind is locked into an old mindset and how he understands God will work.

Peter's in Joppa, and three men come to the house. Peter doesn't go looking for them, God brings them to him.

When we position our hearts and we're present in the situation where God places us, He'll bring His divine purpose to us.

He's Building Maturity

Luke 15:17a "When he finally came to his senses..."

That's a statement of maturity. 'When he finally came to his senses....' He's no longer driven by feeling and desire.

Ephesians 4:14 "Then we will no longer be immature like children. We won't be tossed and blown about by every wind of new teaching. We will not be influenced when people try to trick us with lies so clever they sound like the truth."

We don't need to be shaken by every trial. Though the storms may come and the winds may blow, Jesus is still your Rock.

Spiritual growth and maturity are not a function of time, they're a function of commitment and obedience.

Acts 1:11 "'Men of Galilee,' they said, 'why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

3. He's Building Something that Has His Presence	
Exodus 33:15,16 "If You don't personally go with us, don't make us leave this place. How will anyone know that You look	
favorably on me - on me and on Your people - if You don't go with us? For Your presence among us sets Your people and me apart from all other people on the earth."	2. How is that reassuring for you?
Psalm 139:7 "Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?"	
There's nowhere we can go to flee from the presence of the Spirit. In fact, we'd never want to.	
Our challenge isn't so much in knowing it as it is in experiencing it.	
To be attentive to the presence of the Spirit we need to filter out the noise of life.	
Because His presence is able to work through us in our everyday lives as we welcome and acknowledge Him.	3. How can we take action
The Lord uses ordinary people with ordinary lives and ordinary struggles to do extraordinary things.	as followers of Jesus?
Putting it all together (Application)	
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1. You are the church. Jesus' church is not a building, a place, or an institution as many may think. Jesus' church is you, its people, its Jesus followers coming together and living their faith and their life	

based on Jesus' teachings. Growing together and everyone doing their part to strengthen the community of faith and showing others outside of the church the way, the truth and the life through Jesus Christ. You have a mission that Jesus wants you to carry out, you are important.

- 2. Take action. You are called to action our faith. Not just say I am a Christian, a follower of Jesus but truly live out your faith. God is consistent, he doesn't change, he is reliable and in that you can build on without hesitation. Jesus calls you to be a witness of him. What does that mean? A witness is someone that has experience firsthand what he or she shares with others. Can you share with others what Jesus has done in your life? Yes! Then take action to do so. You are called to do so.
- 3. Believe, and action upon it. His presence is with you. After Jesus starts building His church on the Day of Pentecost amazing things start to happen. People are healed. People are raised from the dead. People are delivered. People are set free from prison. It's super spectacular. But we need to remember that the Book of Acts spans about 30 years of history. And it's not 30 years of constant miracles. In between the peaks of the spectacular, we also read of the valleys of challenge and struggle. And we discover that God is with His people as much in the valley as He is on the mountaintop. And we discover that the Lord uses ordinary people with ordinary lives and ordinary struggles to do extraordinary things. The early followers of Jesus aren't spiritual weirdos. They aren't super holy elites. They have doubts, and questions and failures and fears and fights and struggles. They're normal people who walk with God. We just need a desperation to see the Holy Spirit break into our lives in power.

He's done it before, and He can do it again. So, don't accept spiritual mediocrity. Long for God's presence to do amazing things through you. God can do amazing things through you. You just need faith to believe that God will use us. You need faith to believe that He can speak to us and through us. You need faith to believe that He works in us and in our world. Then we need to act upon what we believe about God and upon what we believe God has asked us to do.
