Jude 20-25

"But you, dear friends, must build each other up in your most holy faith, pray in the power of the Holy Spirit, and await the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ, who will bring you eternal life. In this way, you will keep yourselves safe in God's love. And you must show mercy to those whose faith is wavering. Rescue others by snatching them from the flames of judgment. Show mercy to still others, but do so with great caution, hating the sins that contaminate their lives. Now all glory to God, who is able to keep you from falling away and will bring you with great joy into His glorious presence without a single fault. All glory to Him who alone is God, our Saviour through Jesus Christ our Lord. All glory, majesty, power, and authority are His before all time, and in the present, and beyond all time! Amen.

1. He is able to keep you.

Jude 24 "Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling..."

Psalms 121:5 "The Lord watches over you - the Lord is your shade at your right hand."

Galatians 6:9 "Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

Philippians 1:6 "He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."



Reflection Questions

- 1. Where have you experienced God's keeping power in your life?**
Think back on seasons where you could have stumbled or given up but somehow, by His grace, you remained standing. How did God hold you, guide you, or protect you in those moments?
- 2. What does it mean for you personally that God is not just your Savior, but the Keeper of your soul?**
In what ways can you lean into His daily presence more fully in the valleys, the unknowns, and even the celebrations?



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3. How can you be a part of God's keeping work in someone else's life?

Jude calls us to build each other up in faith and to show mercy. Who in your life needs encouragement, prayer, or a reminder that they are not alone?

2. He Will Present You In Joy

Jude 24 "Now all glory to God, who is able to keep you from falling away and will bring you with great joy into His glorious presence without a single fault."

Romans 8:1 "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."



Reflection Questions

1. What does it mean to you that Jesus will present you "without a single fault" and "with great joy"?

How does this truth shape how you see yourself today especially when you're tempted to feel ashamed, unworthy, or defeated?

2. Are you living now in the light of eternity?

In what ways can you shift your focus from just surviving the present to preparing for the joy of that day when you'll stand before Jesus? What changes would that perspective inspire in your priorities, relationships, or daily walk?

3. Who are you helping cross the finish line with joy?

Just as your pastors have poured into your life with love and faith, who in your life might need encouragement, prayer, or a reminder of their worth in Christ? How can you be part of someone else's journey toward that joyful day?

3. To the Only God – all the Glory

Jude 25 "...to the only God our Saviour be glory, majesty, power and authority..."



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Reflection Questions

1. **Is God truly at the center of everything you do your worship, your work, your relationships?**

What areas of your life might need to shift so that His glory, not your own comfort or control, becomes the focus?

2. **How can you actively give glory to God in your daily life?**

Think about the practical, ordinary places your home, your workplace, your interactions with others. What would it look like to reflect His glory there?

3. **What legacy of glory are you leaving for others?**

Just as your pastors have passed the torch with a desire to see Jesus always glorified, who are you influencing to live for His glory and how can you help them see that Jesus is the treasure worth everything?

4. Now and Forever, Keep Going

Jude 25 "All glory, majesty, power and authority are His before all time, and in the present, and beyond all time! Amen."

Hebrews 13:8 "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever."

Isaiah 40:8 "The grass withers and the flowers fade, but the word of our God stands forever."

Genesis 50:15,16 "So they sent this message to Joseph: Before your father died, he instructed us to say to you: 'Please forgive your brothers for the great wrong they did to you - for their sin in treating you so cruelly.' So we, the servants of the God of your father, beg you to forgive our sin."

Reflection Questions

1. **How does having an eternal perspective change the way you live today?**

In what areas of your life might you need to zoom out and remember that God's story stretches beyond your current moment?



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2. **Are you actively listening for God's voice not secondhand, but personally and directly?**

What can you do to deepen your connection to His Word and His Spirit, especially in seasons of transition or uncertainty?

3. **What will you continue to build for the Kingdom now and forever?**

As the baton is passed and a new season begins, how are you called to keep going, keep serving, and keep trusting that the story ends in glory?
